**I. SUMMARY OF LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY**

**A. Sponsored Bills**

The Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office sponsored thirteen (13) bills in 2009. Ten (10) of these bills were chaptered into law and one (1) bill was vetoed by the Governor. The remaining bills will be heard by the Legislature in 2010.

**B. Supported Bills**

The Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office supported eight-eight (88) bills in 2009. Forty-three (43) of these bills were chaptered into law. Most of the remaining bills are eligible for consideration in 2010.

**C. Opposed Bills**

The Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office opposed thirty (30) bills in 2009. Twenty-eight (28) of these bills either failed to pass out of the Legislature, were vetoed or were amended to remove provisions objected to by our office.

**D. Watched Bills**

The Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office monitored an additional two hundred and thirty-four (234) bills in 2009, informing deputy district attorneys of issues which affect prosecutors.

**II. NEW LAWS SPONSORED BY THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE**

**A. The following is a summary of legislations sponsored by the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office which were chaptered into law during the 2009 Legislative Session:**

**1. CRIMINAL PROCEDURE**

**ASSEMBLY BILL 1516 (Lieu)**

**Mental Defenses**

In *Verdin v. Superior Court*, the California Supreme Court held that the prosecution is no longer entitled to a court order requiring a defendant to submit to a mental health examination by a prosecution expert after the defendant has claimed a mental defense, and that only the Legislature may authorize a court to order the appointment of a prosecution mental health expert when a defendant has placed his or her mental state at issue in a criminal case or juvenile proceeding. AB 1516 authorizes a court to order, upon timely request of the prosecution, a defendant or juvenile to submit to an examination by a prosecution-retained mental health expert whenever the defendant or respondent places their mental state in issue at any phase of the criminal action or juvenile proceeding through proposed testimony of any mental health expert.

**SENATE BILL 150 (Wright)**

**Determinate Sentencing: *Cunningham v. California***

SB 150 was enacted in response to the U.S. Supreme Court decision in *Cunningham v. California*, which held that California's determinate sentencing laws violated a defendant's right to a trial and jury under the Sixth and Fourteenth Amendments. SB 150 corrects the Constitutional defect in the current law without disrupting California's existing sentencing scheme. Consistent with the holding from *Cunningham*, SB 150 explicitly gives judges the discretion to order an upper term sentence when imposing a sentence enhancement with a low, middle, and upper term.

**2. DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**

**SENATE BILL 197 (Pavley)**

**Domestic Violence: Conditional Examination**

Under current law, when the life of a witness is in jeopardy in a domestic violence case, there is no procedure to preserve the testimony of that witness if a witness fails to testify due to threats upon his or her life. SB 197 remedies this problem by authorizing the conditional examination of witnesses or victims in domestic violence cases where (1) the life of the witness is in jeopardy; or (2) there is evidence that a victim or material witness has been or is being dissuaded by any means from cooperating with the prosecution or testifying at trial.

### **3. WEAPONS**

#### **ASSEMBLY BILL 714 (Feuer)**

##### **Composite Knuckles**

Composite knuckles are as strong as traditional brass knuckles and cause an equal or greater amount of damage when used to attack another person. However because they are not made out of metal, it was not illegal to possess them in California. AB 714 makes the possession, manufacture, importation, or sale of composite knuckles a misdemeanor.

#### **ASSEMBLY BILL 870 (Hubber)**

##### **Box Cutters/Razor Blades: School Grounds**

Current law identifies a list of weapons that are prohibited from being possessed on school campuses, which includes a "razor with an unguarded blade." Recent court decisions interpreting what constitutes a "razor with an unguarded blade" declared that the possession of a single razor blade or the possession of a box cutter is not prohibited, however. AB 870 closes this loophole by adding razor blades and box cutters to the list of prohibited weapons on school campuses.

### **4. AUTOMOBILE THEFT**

#### **ASSEMBLY BILL 286 (Salas)**

##### **Automobile Theft: Vehicle Registration Fees**

The state law authorizing counties to collect a \$1 vehicle registration fee to fund vehicle theft prevention, investigation, and prosecution programs was set to expire on January 1, 2010. AB 286 extends the sunset date of this fee until January 1, 2018. Without these funds, California would have been forced to disband all regional auto theft task forces, one of our most valuable tools to combat auto theft in California. The enactment of AB 286 ensures that this essential law enforcement tool is available for the foreseeable future. **This bill was co-sponsored with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and the San Diego County District Attorney's Office.**

### **5. ELDER ABUSE**

#### **ASSEMBLY BILL 76 (Yamada)**

##### **Criminal History Information: California Public Records Act**

The state law authorizing the collection of a \$1 fee on life insurance and annuity policies to help fund financial elder and dependent abuse cases was set to expire on January 1, 2010. AB 76 extends the sunset date of this fee until January 1, 2015. The enactment of AB 76 ensures that funding to assist in the investigation and prosecution of these important elder abuse cases remains available.

## **6. CONSUMER PROTECTION**

### **ASSEMBLY BILL 568 (Lieu)**

#### **Counterfeit Goods: Public Nuisance**

AB 568 provides that every nonresidential building or place used for the purpose of willfully manufacturing, intentionally selling, or knowingly possessing for sale any counterfeit goods is a public nuisance which shall be enjoined, abated, and prevented, and for which damages may be recovered. AB 568 authorizes a district attorney, city attorney, or any citizen or resident to bring a nuisance action against the property to ensure the property owner does not permit the sale or manufacturing of counterfeit goods on the property.

**Chapter 09-453 (HDDA Thomas Papageorge)**

### **ASSEMBLY BILL 992 (Lieu)**

#### **Residential Property Taxes: Property Tax Scams**

Fraud artists are sending deceptive mailers to homeowners offering help to reduce property tax assessments if the homeowner pays them hundreds of dollars in fees. These fraud artists use fake companies with official-sounding names such as "Tax Adjusters," "Tax Readjustment" or "Tax Review" to make victims believe the company is a government agency. In reality, property tax reassessment is a free service provided by county tax assessors. AB 992 addressed this problem by (1) Providing a clarified definition of "assessment reduction filing service" which covers all such solicitations; (2) Eliminating the loophole for any person who "actively advocates" for the owners (even those who provide active advocacy should follow the law's requirements on clear disclosure and prohibited practices); (3) Strengthening the prohibition on collecting advance fees for these services; (4) Prohibiting the collecting of "late fees" for these services; and (5) Requiring that written authorization from the property owner must be provided before any such reassessment request is filed.

**This bill was co-sponsored by the Los Angeles County Assessor's Office and the California Assessors' Association.**

## **7. SEXUALLY VIOLENT PREDATORS**

### **SENATE BILL 174 (Tony Strickland)**

#### **Public Safety Omnibus Bill**

Among the many provisions of SB 174 was technical clean-up language to legislation enacted by our office in 2008 that clarifies that the Department of Mental Health and the Board of Parole Hearings can release a sexually violent predator's information to district attorneys, defense counsel and their investigators.

**III. NEW LAWS SUPPORTED BY THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE:**

**A. The following is a summary of bills actively supported by the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office which were chaptered into law during the 2009 Legislative Session:**

**1. SEX CRIMES**

**Assembly Bill 17 (Swanson)**

**Human Trafficking**

Adds abduction or procurement for prostitution to California's criminal profiteering asset forfeiture law, and a fine of up to \$20,000, in addition to any other fines and penalties may be imposed, where the defendant has been convicted of abduction of a minor for purposes of prostitution or procurement of a minor under the age of 16 for lewd conduct. Fifty per cent of the additional fine shall be deposited in the Victim-Witness Assistance Fund for purposes of grants to community-based organizations that serve minor victims of human trafficking.

**Chapter 09-211 (HDDA Carol Burke, DIC Abram Weisbrot)**

**Assembly Bill 307 (Cook)**

**Sex Offenders: Working with Minors**

Clarifies that the Penal Code section prohibiting registered sex offenders whose victim was a minor under 16 years of age from working in a position where he will be working directly and in an unaccompanied setting with minors and includes providing goods or services to minors.

**Chapter 09-430 (HDDA Michele Daniels)**

**Senate Bill 669 (Hollingsworth)**

**Sexually Violent Predators: Jury Instruction**

Provides that, in a trial to determine whether or not a person is still a sexually violent predator, the court shall instruct the jury that failure to participate in or complete the prescribed sex offender treatment may be considered evidence that a person's condition has not changed.

**Chapter 09-61 (HDDA Michele Daniels)**

**Senate Bill 325 (Alquist)**

**Sex Offenders: Risk Assessment**

Makes several changes to the State-Authorized Risk Assessment Tool for Sex Offenders (SARATSO) law, including the creation of an additional protocol which allows an agency to submit a case to specified experts for review when the agency believes that an individual's SARATSO score does not represent the person's true risk level.

**Chapter 09-582 (HDDA Michele Daniels)**

**Senate Bill 668 (Hollingsworth)**

**Sex Offenders**

Specifies that the maximum one-year misdemeanor punishment for failure to provide complete and accurate information required on sex offender registration and re-registration forms of the Department of Justice shall not be construed to limit or prevent prosecution under any other applicable provision of law.

**Chapter 09-60 (HDDA Michele Daniels)**

**Senate Bill 588 (Senate Public Safety Committee)**

**Sex Offender Management Board**

Eliminates the January 1, 2010 sunset date of the Sex Offender Management Board.

**Chapter 09-191 (HDDA Michele Daniels)**

**2. VICTIM/WITNESS**

**Senate Bill 748 (Leno)**

**Witness Relocation and Assistance Program**

Provides that no person or private entity shall post the home address, telephone number, or personal identifying information on the Internet that discloses the location of any witness or witness family member participating in the Witness Relocation and Assistance Program with the intent that another person use that information to commit a crime involving against that witness or witness' family member.

**Chapter 09-613 (DIR Donna Wills)**

**Senate Bill 314 (Calderon)**

**Crime Victims**

Directs the State Controller to deduct unpaid restitution fines from a person's income tax refund; and authorizes the Victims Compensation and Government Claims Board to authorize reimbursement of more than \$2,000 for a victim's relocation expenses, where the additional money is appropriate due to the unusual, dire, or exceptional circumstances of a particular claim.

**Chapter 09-578 (Director Donna Wills)**

**Senate Bill 432 (Runner)**

**Crime Victims: Restitution**

Authorizes county probation officers to provide the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) with the restitution orders and victims' contact information for the purpose of distributing the restitution collected on behalf of victims. SB 432 provides that the victim must give consent before contact information is shared with CDCR, and that the information shall remain confidential.

**Chapter 09-49 (Director Donna Wills)**

### **3. CRIMINAL PROCEDURE**

#### **Assembly Bill 250 (Miller)**

##### **Criminal Procedure: Time Waivers: Trial**

Requires that a defendant must withdraw a general waiver in open court, and upon the withdrawal of a general time waiver in open court, a trial date shall be set and all parties shall be properly notified of the date.

**Chapter 09-424 (SA Karol Carleton, AHD David Lopez)**

#### **Senate Bill 226 (Alquist)**

##### **Identity Theft: Venue**

Provides that where identity theft crimes committed by the same defendant or defendants occurred in multiple jurisdictions and the crimes involve the same scheme or substantially similar activity, then any of those jurisdictions is a proper jurisdiction for all of the offenses. SB 226 also provides that jurisdiction also extends to all associated offenses connected together in their commission to the underlying identity theft offenses.

**Chapter 09-40 (HDDA Thomas Papageorge, HDDA Kathryn Showers, AHD Jonathan Fairtlough)**

#### **Assembly Bill 681 (Hernandez)**

##### **Criminal History Information: Psychotherapy**

Permits a health care provider to disclose information about a patient's participation in outpatient psychotherapy when the patient's psychotherapist believes, in good faith, that disclosure is necessary to prevent or lessen a serious and imminent threat to the health or safety of a reasonably foreseeable victim.

**Chapter 09-464 (SA Karol Carleton, AHD David Lopez)**

#### **Senate Bill 318 (Calderon)**

##### **Dog Fighting: Forfeiture**

Provides that any property interest, whether tangible or intangible, acquired through the commission of any specified dog fighting crimes shall be subject to forfeiture, including both personal and real property, profits, proceeds, and the instrumentalities acquired, accumulated, or used by dog fighting participants, organizers, transporters of animals and equipment, breeders and trainers of fighting dogs, and persons who steal or illegally obtain dogs or other animals for fighting, including bait and sparring animals.

**Chapter 09-302 (DDA Deborah Knaan)**

#### 4. SEARCH WARRANTS

##### **Assembly Bill 532 (Lieu)**

##### **Search Warrants: Firearms**

California law requires peace officers at the scene of a domestic violence incident or whenever an individual is apprehended because a mental condition that makes that person a danger to themselves or others to take temporary custody of any firearm or other deadly weapon. However, California law did not provide a constitutionally permissible way to seize the firearms or other deadly weapons in the absence of consent or an exigent circumstance. AB 532 solves this problem by authorizing a court to issue a search warrant to seize any firearm or other deadly weapon authorized by Penal Code §12028.5 or WIC §8102. **This bill was co-sponsored with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.**

**Chapter 09-450 (DIC Carlos Vazquez)**

##### **Assembly Bill 789 (DeLeon)**

##### **Search Warrants: Firearms: Protective Orders**

California law requires persons subject to a domestic violence protective order to relinquish any firearms in their possession or control. Previously, if an individual failed or refused to relinquish their firearms, California law did not provide a constitutionally permissible way for peace officers to seize those weapons. AB 789 solves this problem by authorizing the issuance of a search warrant when the property to be seized includes a firearm owned or controlled by a person subject to a protective order relating to harassment or domestic violence. **This bill was co-sponsored with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.**

**Chapter 09-473 (DIC Carlos Vazquez)**

#### 5. DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

##### **Assembly Bill 91 (Feuer)**

##### **Vehicles: DUI: Interlock Ignition Device**

Requires the DMV to establish a pilot program from July 1, 2010, to January 1, 2016, in the Counties of Alameda, Los Angeles, Sacramento, and Tulare that requires, as a condition of being issued a restricted driver's license, being reissued a driver's license, or having the privilege to operate a motor vehicle reinstated following any DUI conviction, that the person install an interlock ignition device on all vehicles he or she owns or operates for a specified period of time.

**Chapter 09-271 (AHD Peter Burke, DIC Victor Rodriguez, AHD Wayne Sato)**

## 6. HATE CRIMES

### **Assembly Bill 412 (Carter)**

#### **Hate Crimes: Nooses**

Creates a misdemeanor offense to hang a noose, knowing it to be a symbol representing a threat to life, in order to terrorize a person who owns, occupies, attends school at, is employed at, or is associated with, the property where the noose is hung.

**Chapter 09-106 (HDDA Peter Cagney)**

## 7. GANGS

### **Senate Bill 492 (Maldonado)**

#### **Loitering: Registered Criminal Street Gang Members**

Increases the penalties for registered gang members who return within 72 hours to a school or other public place at or where children congregate after being asked to leave by an authorized official.

**Chapter 09-592 (HDDA Gary Hearnberger, HDDA Anne Ingalls)**

## 8. MORTGAGE CRIMES

### **Senate Bill 239 (Pavley)**

#### **Mortgage Fraud**

Defines mortgage fraud as a separate form of fraud, in which the fraudulent acts involve loans secured by real property, and places mortgage fraud in a stand-alone section, with the same alternate felony/misdemeanor penalties as the general crime of fraud, and applies the procedures for obtaining escrow and financial records to mortgage fraud investigations.

**Chapter 09-174 (DIC Daniel Baker, AHD Maria Palomino)**

### **Senate Bill 94 (Calderon)**

#### **Mortgage Loans**

Prohibits persons from charging advance fees to borrowers in connection with a loan modification, and requires those who wish to charge a fee for loan modification services to provide a notice to borrowers regarding other options available to the borrower.

**Chapter 09-630 (DIC Daniel Baker, AHD Maria Palomino)**

### **Senate Bill 36 (Calderon)**

#### **Real Estate Licenses: Mortgages**

Brings California in compliance with the provisions of the Safe and Fair Enforcement of Mortgage Licensing (SAFE) Act, pursuant to Title V of the provisions of the Housing and Economic Recovery Act of 2008.

**Chapter 09-160 (DIC Daniel Baker, AHD Maria Palomino)**

## **9. PEACE OFFICERS**

### **Assembly Bill 32 (Lieu)**

#### **Public Officials: Personal Information**

Requires a person, business, or association, receiving a written demand of an elected or appointed official or agent (including peace officers), to remove the official's home address or telephone number from public display on the Internet within 48 hours and to continue to ensure that information is not reposted on the same Internet site, any subsidiary site or other site maintained by the recipient of the written demand, or transferred to another person or entity. A violation is punishable by a \$1,000 civil fine.

**Chapter 09-403 (SA Suzanne Pulice)**

### **Senate Bill 52 (Correa)**

#### **Public Safety Officer Medal of Honor**

Allows the California Public Safety Medal of Valor Review Board to meet more than once a year and to recommend more than five candidates for the Medal per year. SB 52 also authorizes the Governor to award a Public Safety Medal of Valor to more than one public safety officer a year.

## **10. DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**

### **Assembly Bill 258 (Ma)**

#### **Domestic Violence: Restraining or Protective Orders**

Amends Penal Code Section 836, concerning arrests in situations where mutual protective orders have been issued, to change the phrase "primary aggressor" to "dominant aggressor."

**Chapter 09-92 (HDDA Victoria Adams)**

### **Assembly Bill 688 (Eng)**

#### **Domestic Violence: Own Recognizance Release**

Currently there is a conflict in the Penal Code regarding when an individual charged with misdemeanor domestic violence may be released on their own recognizance (OR). Penal Code §853.6 allows a peace officer to release a person on their own recognizance without having the person appear in court if the officer believes doing so will not endanger the victim or the victim's property. However, Penal Code §1270.1 states that a person charged with misdemeanor domestic violence cannot be released OR until that person has appeared in court. AB 688 resolves this conflict by clarifying that a peace officer may not OR a person arrested for a misdemeanor domestic violence until after the person has appeared in court. **This bill was co-sponsored with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.**

**Chapter 09-465 (HDDA Victoria Adams)**

**Senate Bill 273 (Corbett)**

**Domestic Violence**

Changes the definition of domestic violence in the comprehensive shelter-based service program administered by the Maternal, Child, and Adolescent Health Division Branch in the Department of Public Health to extend services to males and makes the program subject to specified anti-discrimination provisions. SB 273 also changes the definition of domestic violence in the statewide domestic violence program administered by the California Emergency Management Association to extend services to males.

**Chapter 09-177 (HDDA Victoria Adams)**

**11. WORKERS COMPENSATION**

**Assembly 483 (Buchanan)**

**Workers Compensation: Internet Web sites**

Requires the Workers' Compensation Insurance Rating Bureau to establish a Web site that will among many things, allow a person to inquire whether a particular employer has workers' compensation insurance, using the employer's name, address, or other identifying information and contain a link to the Department of Industrial Relations for self-insured employers.

**Chapter 09-241 (HDDA Scott Carbaugh, AHD Lawrence McGrail)**

**12. PUBLIC INTEGRITY**

**Assembly Bill 265 (Cook)**

**Office Holding: Forfeiture**

Requires an elected state official to forfeit their office upon a conviction of a crime that involves a false claim of receipt of any military decoration or medal pursuant to the federal Stolen Valor Act of 2005. Currently, only local elected officials are subject to forfeiture of office for such a conviction.

**Chapter 09-93 (HDDA David Demerjian, AHD Jennifer Snyder)**

**Assembly Bill 269 (Silva)**

**Elections: Corruption of Voting**

Creates a misdemeanor crime for an individual observing the processing of vote-by-mail ballots, the semi-official canvas, the official canvas, or a recount from willfully doing any of the following: (1) attempting to ascertain the identity and ballot choices of a voter, or having observed or learned the identity of a voter, attempting to ascertain the ballot choices of that voter, (2) opening a provisional or vote-by-mail ballot envelope containing a voted ballot in order to ascertain the voter's ballot choices, or (3) making or placing a mark or device on any ballot or secrecy envelope in an attempt to ascertain the voter's ballot choices.

**Chapter 09-94 (HDDA David Demerjian, AHD Jennifer Snyder)**

### **13. CONSUMER PROTECTION**

#### **Senate Bill 95 (Corbett)**

##### **Car Buyers' Protection Act of 2009**

Enacts the California Car Buyer' Protection Act of 2009, which among it's many provisions provides that it is the intent of the Legislature by increasing the fee for the annual renewal of the license of a dealer and of a lessor-retailer by \$25 that \$40 of the total fee shall be utilized by the Department of Motor Vehicles for the investigation of those dealers and lessor-retailers who demonstrate the greatest potential for causing losses to consumers as shown by repeated consumer complaints, habitual violations of the requirements of their licenses, the issuance of a probationary license by the department, or a violation of other standards and criteria established by the department for these purposes.

**Chapter 09--556 (HDDA Thomas Papageorge)**

#### **Senate Bill 40 (Correa)**

##### **Personal Information: Social Security Numbers**

Imposes a number of restrictions on the use of social security numbers in public records. Among it's provisions, SB 40 provides that a document containing more than the last four digits of social security numbers is not eligible for recording beginning January 1, 2010, and that an abstract of judgment only needs to contain the last four digits of the social security number of the party who is ordered to pay spousal, child, or family support.

**Chapter 09-552 (HDDA Thomas Papageorge, HDDA Kathryn Showers, AHD Jonathan Fairtlough)**

#### **Assembly Bill 22 (Torres)**

##### **Computer Hacking: Financial Institutions**

Increases the maximum fine that can be imposed on a defendant convicted of felony crimes involving unauthorized use of computers, damage to computers or computer data, and related offenses such as harmful misappropriation of an Internet domain name, from \$10,000 to \$12,000.

**Chapter 09-70 (HDDA Thomas Papageorge, HDDA Kathryn Showers, AHD Jonathan Fairtlough)**

### **14. POACHING**

#### **Assembly Bill 708 (Huffman)**

##### **Fish and Wildlife: Poaching**

Makes various changes to the Fish and Game Code including increasing the fine for poaching to a fine of not less than \$5,000 (\$18,500 with penalty assessments), nor more than \$40,000 (\$148,000 with penalty assessments), or imprisonment in the county jail for not more than one year, or by both fine and imprisonment.

**Chapter 09-290 (DDA Deborah Knaan)**

**Assembly Bill 1442 (Huffman)**

**Fish and Game: Poaching**

Authorizes the Department of Fish and Game to enter into reciprocal agreements with authorized representatives of any Oregon, Nevada, or Arizona state law enforcement agency to promote expeditious and effective law enforcement service to the public, and deems any regularly employed law enforcement officer of an Oregon, Nevada, or Arizona state law enforcement agency a peace officer in this state, if specified conditions are met.

**Chapter 09-294 (HDDA Stanley Williams, DDA Deborah Knaan)**

**15. CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS**

**Senate Bill 447 (Yee)**

**Criminal Records: Historian**

Requires the Department of Justice to establish and maintain a confirmation program to process fingerprint-based criminal record background clearances on individuals designated by an agency as a custodian of records .

**Chapter 09-50 (SA Karol Carleton, AHD David Lopez)**

**Assembly Bill 428 (Fletcher)**

**Criminal History Records: Adoption**

Adds foreign governments to the list of entities to which the Attorney General has explicit authority to release criminal records, provided that the release is requested by the individual who is the subject of the record and is done for the purposes of adopting a foreign national child, and also allows a person to obtain a copy of their own state summary criminal history information from the Department of Justice for purpose of attempting to adopt a minor foreign national.

**Chapter 09-441 (HDDA Victoria Adams, HDDA Michele Daniels)**

**Assembly Bill 595 (Adams)**

**Placement of Children: Criminal Background Checks**

Conforms California law to federal law by requiring background checks and by prohibiting persons convicted of specified offenses from becoming foster or adoptive parents.

**Chapter 09-246 (HDDA Victoria Adams, HDDA Michele Daniels)**

**16. VEHICLES**

**Assembly Bill 14 (Fuentes)**

**Vehicles: Nuisance Abatement: Impoundment**

Authorizes a local government entity to enact a nuisance abatement ordinance under which a vehicle used in illegal dumping or prostitution would be subject to seizure and impoundment for up to 30 days if the operator of the vehicle has a prior conviction for the same offense within the past three years.

**Chapter 09-210 (SA Suzanne Pulice)**

**Assembly Bill 144 (Ma)**

**Automated Fingerprint ID Fund**

Provides that a city or county, in lieu of criminal prosecution, may issue a civil parking citation for the unauthorized use, lending, or display of a disability license plate or placard, parking in a disabled space or displaying a disability license plate or placard to obtain parking privileges when the vehicle is not being used to transport the authorized user of the plate or placard, or when the plate or placard is counterfeit, forged, altered, or mutilated. The civil penalty may be set at an amount between \$250 and \$1,000.

**Chapter 09-415 (HDDA Carol Burke, DIC Abram Weisbrot)**

**17. MISCELLANEOUS**

**Assembly Bill 275 (Solorio)**

**Missing Persons: DNA Database**

Eliminates the sunset date, makes the Missing Persons DNA Data Base fees on death certificates issued by a local government or the State of California permanent, and clarifies the procedure for identifying the backlog of unidentified remains or donated familial samples by eliminating the advisory committee to prioritize case analysis. Instead, the Department of Justice shall give priority to cases involving children and homicide victims.

**Chapter 09-228 (ADA Sharon Matsumoto)**

**Assembly Bill 83 (Feuer)**

**Torts: Person Liability Immunity**

Provides that no person who in good faith and not for compensation renders emergency medical or nonmedical care or assistance at the scene of an emergency shall be liable for civil damages resulting from any act or omission other than an act or omission constituting gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct. This bill overturned the California Supreme Court ruling in *Van Horn v. Watson*, which had sought to limit California's "Good Samaritan" law.

**Chapter 09-77 (SA Suzanne Pulice)**

**Senate Bill 676 (Wolk)**

**Local Fees**

Increases or eliminates the statutory limits on 11 local fees including the deletion of the \$10 maximum fee that could be charged for taking fingerprints of a person who is an applicant for licensing, employment, or certification, allowing local agencies to charge a fee sufficient to cover the cost of taking the fingerprints and the required processing, and increasing the fee from \$120 to \$150 that a person who petitions for a change of plea or setting aside of a verdict may be charged.

**Chapter 09-606 (Director Lynn Vodden)**

**Assembly Bill 1245 (Monning)**

**Recovery of Public Records**

Establishes a process by which the Secretary of State or a local agency may seek the return of public records belonging to the state or local agency from a person, organization, or institution not authorized by law to possess those records, or require that person to respond in writing and declare why the records do not belong to the state or local agency.

**Chapter 09-519 (HDDA Irene Wakabayashi)**

**IV. LEGISLATION OPPOSED BY THE LOS ANGELES DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE**

**A. The Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office opposed thirty (30) bills in the 2009 Legislative Session. Of these bills:**

1. Only two (2) bills opposed by the LADA were enacted.
2. Twenty-one bills (21) opposed by the LADA failed to pass out of the Legislature.
3. Three (3) bills were vetoed by the Governor.
4. Opposition to four (4) bills was removed after the author accepted amendments suggested by the LADA or other opponents.

In many instances, the assignment included testimony before the legislative policy committees.
3. In order to avoid double counting of bills, legislation in which the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office changed its position from "oppose" to "watch" are not counted in the "watch" category but are instead counted in the "oppose" total, and bills listed as "support if amended" are not counted in the "support" category but are instead counted in the "watch" total.
